

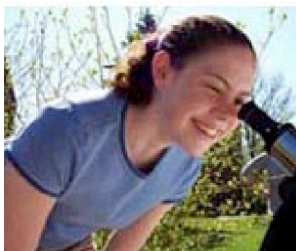

Mount Allison's Summer Camp Extravaganza

Camps offered for middle and high school students in a number of areas

Building on the success of last year's Go Global program, Mount Allison's conference services office is co-ordinating an array of activity for young students this summer. With the help of Mount Allison faculty, staff, and students, the University is offering on-campus day and overnight camps for young people in a number of diverse areas. Go Global — Offers week-long camps in international relations and intensive scientific research for high school students. The camp fee of \$500 will be reimbursed as a Go Global scholarship should the camper decide to pursue their post-secondary studies at Mount Allison.



Leaders Today Take Action! East Coast Academy — Mount Allison is partnering with Leaders Today, the sister organization of Free the Children, to host the East Coast Academy. The five-day camp (Aug. 13-17) will allow high school students to enhance their leadership skills.

Spanish Language Village — Middle and high school students will be immersed in the Hispanic culture, with language instruction, history lessons, traditional art lessons, cooking, and daily activities.

SHOCK@MTA — In a three-day science camp opened for boys and girls in grades 5-8, students will work with Mount A students, faculty, and staff, conducting hands on experiments (www.mta.ca/shock).

S.P.Y. (Sustainable Planning

Youth) Camp — A day camp for 10-12 year olds that will allow campers to investigate facts about their towns, land uses, environmental issues, and local culture and heritage.
