Over the past 17 years, Mount Allison University has placed in the #1 spot for 12 years with the other five years in second place, according to MacLean's magazine. Mount Allison has produced 47 Rhodes Scholars, more per capita than any other university in the Commonwealth.

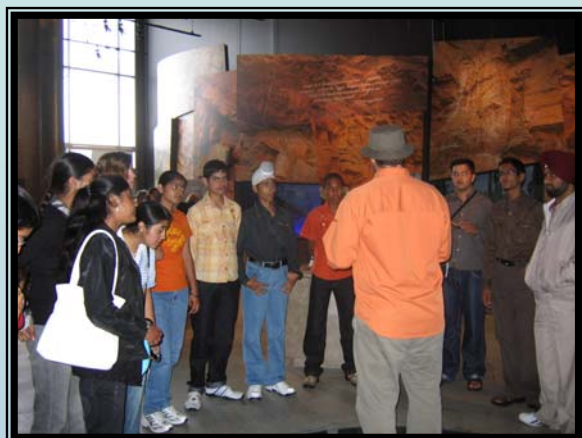
Summer Camps Staff



The Go Global Camps hire Mount Allison University students who possess excellent personal and academic skills and have a long history of working with children at other camps around the Maritimes. Each of the camp staff is certified in CPR and First-Aid. All staff also pass a police check. They live on-site to provide 24 hour care and supervision.



Program features



English Classes

We provide an average of 15 hours of English Classes each week. Language skills covered include grammar, reading, writing, vocabulary and conversation. The students learn, play, sing, and socialize in English.

Afternoon Activities

We carefully plan our outings, activities, and travel for students to experience Canada's history, natural beauty and culture. Students will have many chances to interact with local residents and international students on campus.

Meals

Students will eat in the award winning Jennings "all you care to eat" style Dining Hall. Meals are offered three times a day Monday to Friday, with two meals on weekends. Special emphasis is placed on international food in the dining hall during the summer and students will have the opportunity to help prepare and showcase dishes from their own country. Healthy food is freshly prepared and customized for students with menus posted each week. Water and juice are available all day in the residence lounge. Healthy snacks are provided in the evenings.

Residences

Students will live in Windsor Hall, a residence centrally located on the beautiful Mount Allison University campus. The residence monitor to student ratio is 10:1 with a minimum of two senior students assigned to each group at all times.

Afternoon and weekend travels

Located in Sackville, New Brunswick, Mount Allison University is only thirty minutes from downtown Moncton and less than ten minutes from Amherst, Nova Scotia. It sits in the very heart of the Maritime Provinces on the east coast of Canada.

Students will have opportunities to visit our beautiful beaches, local ranches, or take day trips to Moncton, Prince Edward Island or Halifax.

Final week long trips to Toronto, Montreal, or other cities can also be customized by special arrangement.
