

The Department of Mathematics and Computer Science at Mount Allison University is seeking candidates for two full-time teaching appointments during the 2014-15 academic year, subject to budgetary approval.

The first position is a one year Margaret and Wallace McCain Fellowship requiring the candidate to teach three one-term courses during the September-April academic year. The fellowship offers a competitive salary and the University provides additional research and travel funds. Relocation assistance and a complete benefits package are also provided.

The second position is a 4.5 month appointment at the Lecturer or Assistant Professor level requiring the candidate to teach two one-term courses during either the Fall or Winter term. For both positions, the successful candidates will teach a mixture of introductory and upper-year courses in mathematics.

Candidates for the McCain Fellowship must have recently completed a Ph.D. in Mathematics or Statistics. Candidates for the second position should have a Ph.D in Mathematics or Statistics or be close to completion with an active research program. Individuals with interests similar to current members of the department will be given preference. Current research interests of the department include graph theory, symplectic geometry, category theory, and mathematical modeling in biological systems.

Applications must include a cover letter, c.v., and statements of teaching and research interests. Candidates should arrange for three letters of reference to be sent. All materials should be submitted online at mathjobs.org.
