

The Department of Mathematics and Computer Science at Mount Allison University invites applications for an 18-month term position to teach Mathematics and Statistics. Candidates should have a Ph.D. in Mathematics or Statistics and have a strong commitment to undergraduate teaching. Preference will be given to candidates working in statistics or applied mathematics.

The successful candidate will teach six undergraduate courses in mathematics (two courses per term, in the Winter 2019, Fall 2019, and Winter 2020 terms). Courses for the Winter 2019 term are Math 1251 (Finite Mathematics) and Math 3031 (History of Mathematics). Courses for the 2019-2020 academic year are yet to be determined, but will include statistics and/or applied mathematics courses. The appointment will be made at the rank of Lecturer or Assistant Professor and will commence on January 1, 2019, subject to budgetary approval.

Applications should include a cover letter, curriculum vitae, statement of teaching experience and interests, research statement, and letters from three referees with at least one addressing your teaching skills. Applications must be submitted online at www.mathjobs.org. The search committee will begin reviewing applications on Friday, October 12th, 2018, and will continue until the position is filled.
