

Metadata Laboratory Post-Doctoral Student/Manager

The Centre for Early Modern Visual Culture at Mount Allison University comprises the research lab of the Canada Research Chair in Intercultural Encounter. The CEMVC is seeking candidates for the position of Metadata Laboratory Post-Doctoral Student (if a PhD is already in hand) or Manager (if a PhD is not in hand).

Duties include:

1. Supervising and training approximately 25 students, in concert with our part-time supervisor, using the training modules already created for our data management system, database and its related platform, and scanning programme.
2. Creating a website for the CEMVC and supervising a student who will manage the CEMVC's social media presence.
3. Reviewing the metadata generated by the student team for quality and accuracy.
4. Researching the CEMVC's metadata collections as per the needs of its research team.
5. Participating in the CEMVC's activities, which may include conferences, workshops, classes, research outreach, among other possibilities.

Ideal candidates will possess advanced degrees in one or more of the following fields: digital humanities, history, visual culture, Hispanic studies, book history, or library sciences.

Candidates will be expected to develop sufficient expertise so to review metadata for literary masterworks from Europe as well as historical works pertaining to the Americas and which feature book illustrations, and which are published in a variety of languages. While no specific language expertise is required, candidates should be literate in more than one western language. Candidates will preferably possess research knowledge of and experience working with early-modern books, and are encouraged to research the CEMVC's collections for their own research programme or with the view of collaborating with the CEMVC's research team.

Salary: \$45,000 + benefits.

Mount Allison University is located at the cross-roads of the Maritimes, about 20 minutes from the Moncton Airport, and 10 minutes from the Nova Scotia border, in the charming community of Sackville. As a liberal arts-focused school, the university enjoys a vibrant campus culture and offers an array of activities and opportunities for faculty and students alike.

While funding for this position is guaranteed for one year, it is expected that more funds will be secured to extend this employment opportunity. The successful applicant may begin their employment at their earliest convenience and will be required to relocate to Sackville, New Brunswick for the duration of this appointment.

Depending on teaching needs, the post-doctoral student may be offered teaching assignments with remuneration beyond what is offered for the present employment opportunity.
